CLIMBING/GUIDING/INSTRUCTION SEASON

The ice climbing season in Colorado can last from mid-October to mid-April in the high mountain areas in the San Juans. Early season climbing in November, December, & early January can be incredible on the long WI 4 to 5 routes (1.000+ feet) in the high mountain areas of Ouray, Silverton, and Telluride Colorado. Stairway to Heaven in Eureka, Colorado is one such incredible classic ice route amongst many. Once the heavy snows begin, the avalanche danger in these high areas generally becomes too high for safe climbing, but it does depend on the year.
